Gaps in Adult Health Status by Level of Education: How Do States Compare?

Differences in adult health status¹ by educational attainment are similar at the state level to those seen among adults nationally. In every state, differences in health are seen between the most-educated adults and those with less education. These differences occur along a gradient that includes not only adults with the most and least education, but those in the middle as well. Compared with adults who have graduated

from college, adults who have not completed high school experience particularly marked shortfalls, but even those who have attended some college are less healthy than college graduates. Comparing states based on the size of the gap² in adult health status by education tells us that Americans are not as healthy as they could be—both nationally and in every state.
